Minutes of Regularly Scheduled Public Meeting of March 26, 2001

1. The ANC 3-C held its regularly scheduled meeting on Monday, March 26, 2001, at the 2d District Police Station, 3320 Idaho Avenue, NW, Washington, DC.
2. Chair MacWood called the meeting to order at 7:33 p.m.
3. The Chair acknowledged that a quorum was present (Comms. MacWood, Saranovich, Doggett, Vorndran, Rohde present). [Comm. Welsh absent through the duration of the meeting.]
4. The Chair verified that the meeting had been appropriately noticed.
5. The agenda was approved.
6. The Metropolitan Police Department provided a PSA announcement. Comm. Opacinch arrived at 7:44pm.
7. Theresa Lewis, Deputy Director of Operations, DC DCRA (along with Michael Johnson of the same office) offered up a presentation on the Cleveland Park and Woodley Park overlay districts. [Coordinates: email: Theresa.lewis@dc.gov; tel: 202-442-4947]. [Comm. Bartel arrived 7:50pm.] Ms. Lewis took many questions from the ANC and the audience. Among other things, she indicated that based in zoning regulations, “vesting” occurs with use, regardless of appropriate permitting; that Cleveland Park overlay limit on restaurants has been exceeded; that DCRA is getting new computerized system (moving from earlier index card system) that should facilitate accurate permitting; that accurate measurements on the Cleveland Park and Woodley Park overlays would be done and provided to ANC by Friday, March 30; that DCRA will be making use of accredited 3d party inspectors.
8. Erik Gaull, Director of Operational Improvements, Mayor’s office, [Coordinates: email: erik.gaull@dc.gov; Tel. 202/727-6053] addressed ANC and audience on DC General, Mayor’s budget, tax reassessments, this last matter being referred to the ANC 3-C Budget and Finance Committee. Andrew Hamilton, representing Friends of Rosedale, provided a status report on sale by Youth for Understanding of Rosedale estate.
9. National Cathedral Tour Bus issue opened for discussion. Comm. Hyde offered up a resolution, seconded by Comm. Doggett.
10. Julie Cook, Director of Visitor Services of the National Cathedral, and Colleen Meehan, both of the National Cathedral, addressed the ANC and responded to questions from the ANC and the audience, regarding the problem of too many tour buses in front of the Cathedral.
11. Comm. Vorndran offered a friendly amendment, which was accepted.
12. Comm. Vorndran offered up another friendly amendment, which was rejected.

13. Vorndran friendly amendment voted on and passed by voice 7-1 vote (Comm. Hydle, against).
14. ANC 3-C Resolution No. 2001-015, attached, passed by a voice vote of 7-1 (Comm. Bartel, against).
15. Chair MacWood moved a resolution modifying Resolutions 2001-011 and 2001-012, related to antenna towers. Resolution No. 2001-016, attached, passed by unanimous voice vote (8-0).
16. Treasurer Hydle provided the treasurer's report.
17. Treasurer Hydle moved a resolution to change the name under which the ANC 3-C bank account is held, pursuant to D.C. law. Resolution No. 2001-017, attached, passed by unanimous voice vote (8-0). Treasurer Hydle provided the 2Q FY 2001 report and offered up a resolution that it be approved. Resolution No. 2001-018, attached, passed by unanimous voice vote (8-0). Treasurer Hydle presented the budget for FY 2001. He offered up a resolution that the Commission adopt the budget. Resolution No. 2001-019 approved by unanimous voice vote (8-0).
18. Secretary Rohde moved that the ANC approve the minutes of the regularly scheduled November 2000, December 2000, and February 2001 meetings of ANC 3-C. All minutes were approved together, by unanimous voice vote (8-0).
19. Chair MacWood, per Comm. Welsh's request, reports on Transportation Committee. Chair MacWood moves that a letter be written to DPW asking the agency not to promote any changes in right turn on red rules without providing rationale. Motion approved by unanimous voice vote (8-0)
20. Comm. Vorndran announced April 3 Woodley Park Community Association meeting.
21. Comm. Hydle offers up a resolution on redistricting in the District of Columbia. Chair MacWood seconds. [Comm. Opacinch departs, leaving a "verbal proxy to Comm. Rohde to vote for resolution if passed exactly as proposed.] Chair MacWood offers friendly amendment, which is accepted [thereby voiding Comm. Opacinch "verbal proxy"]. Resolution is discussed. Resolution No. 2001-020, attached, passed by voice vote of 6-1 (Comm. MacWood, against).
22. The Commission heard new business. Community member raised issue of bus lanes during rush hour along Wisconsin Avenue. Matter referred to Transportation Committee.
23. Meeting adjourned at 11:25 p.m.

Resolution No. 2001-015
Related to National Cathedral Tour Bus Parking

1. Whereas the Washington National Cathedral is a major tourist attraction, drawing 579,000 visitors in 2000, of whom about 225,000 arrived by tour bus, according to the Cathedral's statistics, with tour bus traffic especially heavy from March through June;
2. Whereas the tour buses, especially in March through June, have a significant effect on parking, traffic, and air quality in the neighborhood surrounding the Cathedral;
3. Whereas the Cathedral has a master plan to reduce this impact by building underground parking garages, but relief is several years away;
4. Whereas the Cathedral has contracted with the Metropolitan Police Department to use off-duty police officers to enforce traffic laws against double-parking and excessive idling, which has reduced such violations but may have led some tour buses to drive, park, and idle elsewhere in the neighborhood;
5. Whereas the Cathedral has requested, and the D.C. Department of Public Works Division of Parking Services has granted, a temporary restriction from March 13 to April 30, Monday through Saturday, 9:30 am to 4 pm, on the east curb lane of Wisconsin Avenue, NW, between the entrance to the bus lane and Woodley Road, limiting parking to tour buses only, and the Cathedral hopes to extend this restriction to June 30;
6. Whereas this restriction necessarily limits parking for other vehicles, including residents of the neighborhood;
7. Whereas the Cathedral does not permit tour buses to enter the Close, but has as yet no restrictions on parking on the Close for employees of the Cathedral and senior students at St. Alban's School and National Cathedral School;
8. Whereas the National Cathedral School is required by a Board of Zoning Adjustment order and a previous ANC 3-C resolution to develop an Student/Staff Parking Permit Program in consultation with ANC 3-C and interested neighbors;

Resolved, that:

9. ANC 3-C does not object to the current temporary parking restriction on the east curb lane of Wisconsin Ave between South Road and Woodley Road, but insists that there be no further extension of this restriction past April 30 without further advance consultation with ANC 3-C;
10. ANC 3-C strongly urges the Cathedral and the Metropolitan Police Department to strictly enforce traffic laws against double-parking and parked idling by tour buses in front of the Cathedral and elsewhere in the neighborhood;

11. ANC 3-C requests, on or before April 30, the Cathedral to offer tour buses hospitality and parking on the Cathedral Close;
12. ANC 3-C urges the Cathedral to accelerate its efforts to create a parking program for employees and students on the Close which would encourage them to take public transportation to the Cathedral;
13. ANC 3-C directs the Transportation Committee and Commissioners representing directly affected neighborhoods to monitor the situation and work with officials of the Cathedral and the DC government as appropriate; and
14. ANC 3-C will put this issue on its agenda for the April regular meeting to determine whether and if so under what conditions it will support any extension of the special parking restrictions.

This resolution was approved by ANC 3-C by a voice vote of 6-1 at its regular public meeting on March 26, 2001, at which a quorum was present.

**Resolution Amending ANC 3-C Resolutions 2001-11 and 2001-012
Concerning Antennas and Antenna Towers**

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the word “regulations” is changed to “guidelines” in the 3rd Whereas section of Resolution 2001-11;
2. BE IT RESOLVED that a new WHEREAS section of Resolution 2001-11, which supports [paragraphs 6.a. and 6.b. in original, 7a and 7b in corrected version] the Resolve section shall be inserted after 3rd WHEREAS and shall state: “WHEREAS Zoning Commission Order 587 is the prevailing law on antennas”;
3. BE IT RESOLVED that paragraph 7.a. of Resolution 2001-11 shall begin “Antennas and antenna tower permits shall be for a 5 year period and ...”;
4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in Resolution 2001-12, the RESOLVED section [paragraph 6] shall be amended to replace “the moratorium” with “a moratorium.”

Resolution 2001-020
Relating to Redistricting in the District of Columbia

1. Whereas ANC 3-C is the only ANC currently divided between two Wards;
2. Whereas the chairman of the DC Council Committee with jurisdiction over redistricting in 1991 was a Ward Council Member, and the redistricting was conducted so as to benefit incumbent Ward Council Members, who already enjoy substantial competitive advantages over their potential challengers;
3. Whereas the Council in 2001 has sought to limit self-serving redistricting by giving jurisdiction to a subcommittee chaired by an at-large Council Member;
4. Whereas the principles applying to redistricting include respect for natural geography and neighborhood cohesiveness, compact wards and Single Member Districts (SMDs), and non-dilution of the voting strength of minority citizens, but do not include the protection of incumbents;
5. Whereas the Woodley Park community which is divided between two wards is a cohesive neighborhood linked by natural geography to the remainder of ANC 3-C and Ward 3;
6. Whereas, other things being equal, the inclusion of Woodley Park or part of it in Ward 1 has the effect of diluting the voting strength of minority citizens in that Ward;
7. Whereas the Bureau of the Census is required by law to release by April 1 detailed demographic information about the District of Columbia as a basis for redistricting, the D.C. Council Subcommittee on Redistricting has scheduled hearings April 5, 7, and 28, and the Council and Mayor are scheduled to pass a Council Ward redistricting law in June or July;

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that:

8. ANC 3-C strongly urges that ANC 3-C and Woodley Park be redistricted entirely within Ward 3;
9. ANC 3-C strongly urges that the redistricting of Council Wards be accomplished without regard to the political interests of incumbent Council Members;
10. ANC 3-C authorizes and directs the ANC Chair or her designee, and the ANC Administration Committee Chair, to present these views in testimony to the Council Subcommittee on Redistricting and to other appropriate officials.

This resolution was approved by ANC 3-C by a vote of 6-1 (Comm. MacWood, against) at its regular public meeting on March 26, 2001, at which a quorum was present.
